## Plain Food Farmers Market Returns to Plains Art Museum Thursdays During the Summer

**Fargo, N.D.** – Beginning Thursday, July 15, Plains Art Museum will again host a weekly farmer’s market on 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue North in front of the Museum. The Plain Food Farmer’s Market will run from 4 – 7 p.m. every Thursday through September 23.

The Market will offer produce, herbs, flowers, artisanal foods and other items in a setting with a friendly, fun street vibe. It will emphasize healthy, locally grown goods from a variety of local vendors—an artful experience to complement experiences found inside the Museum. The Museum is open until 8 p.m. and admission is free on Market nights.

Participating vendors include Probstfield Farms, Yellow Bird Farms, Eisinger Farm, It's About Thyme, Three Bears Honey, and Green Market Catering.

Plains Art Museum is located at 704 First Avenue North. It is accredited by the American Association of Museums and is a nonprofit, regional fine arts museum with plans to significantly expand its programs through its “Little Artist in All of Us” campaign. The campaign is raising funds for the Center for Creativity and Lifelong Learning which includes the Fingerprints Interactive Education Gallery and working with Fargo Public Schools and other educational entities to build teaching studios. The campaign is also strengthening operations by enhancing the Museum’s endowment and visitor services.
